REGIONAL HIGHLIGHTS:

Auckland

- New Strategic plan with Cultural aspect to the goals.
- Forum day will include Geo group discussions sharing promising practice and successes.
- Merger of Primary and Secondary Associations is being looked at.
- A lot of professional development is being rolled out to support schools with the new bridging document.
- One in every five schools in Auckland will open for the year next week without a full teaching staff. The region faces a desperate teacher shortage driven by rapid population growth, declining numbers of teacher trainees and sky-high house prices that have forced many teachers to move out to smaller towns where they can afford to buy. (Herald January 2018).

Wellington

- We are working to ensure first time principals are receiving appropriate support as the demographic of experienced principals changes.
- Archdiocesan Commissioning Masses have been held in Wellington and Nelson.

Palmerston North

- Stratford parish have no permanent priest this year. Implications with preference cards and financial assistance for families.
- Full school rolls in Taranaki and Whanganui.
- Support for U1 and U2 principals to get to regional and national conferences. One application per person per year, \$500 per application.

Dunedin

- New Bishop-Elect, Fr Michael Dooley.
- Dunedin Kahui Ako focus areas are: Building Leadership Capacity, Spirals of Inquiry and Engagement with each other and the wider community.

Hamilton

- The Central Faith Based Community of Learning has a new leader.
- The Waikato Kahui Ako has had their final sign off from the Minister. The across school leaders are now appointed and have started collaborating.
- The Principals exec are working on a strategic plan to plan for sustainability of the group.
- 'With Hearts Burning' was introduced last year. It focuses on understanding the Emmaus mystery (Luke 24: 13-25) to interpret our present reality.

Christchurch

- New Bishop - Bishop Paul Martin SM.
- Te Mara Akoranga Katorika Catholic Community of Learning have had successful applications for professional development in Science Capabilities and the Learning Progression Framework.
- The first newly built church since the earthquakes, St Mary's New Brighton, was officially opened on March 11.
